## The Intricacies and Ethics of Cases Involving Death

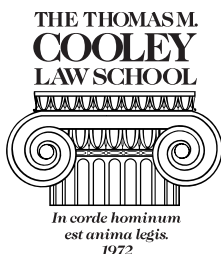
