Mr. Eaman has represented clients in many high-publicity criminal cases in state and federal Michigan courts. Since the 1980s he has been a lead attorney in many court cases that sought public defense reform or fair pay for appointed counsel, and has testified before the Michigan Legislature on public defense issues. Eaman is a frequent speaker on issues of criminal defense and public defense throughout Michigan and at national conferences. Recently, he was interviewed for an NPR report on public defense in Wayne County. Currently, he is one of the counsel for the indigent defendants in *Duncan v Michigan*, a case brought against the State of Michigan and the governor, asking the court to order the state to provide state funding of public defense in Michigan. Eaman is an adjunct professor at Cooley Law School and an instructor at the Criminal Defense Attorneys of Michigan Trial College.

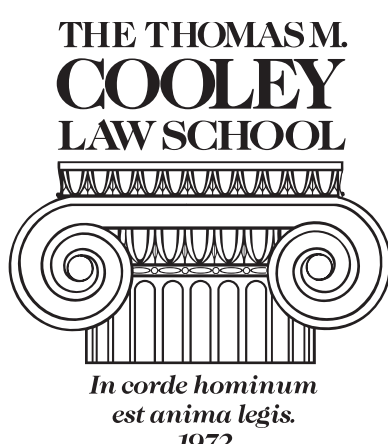
