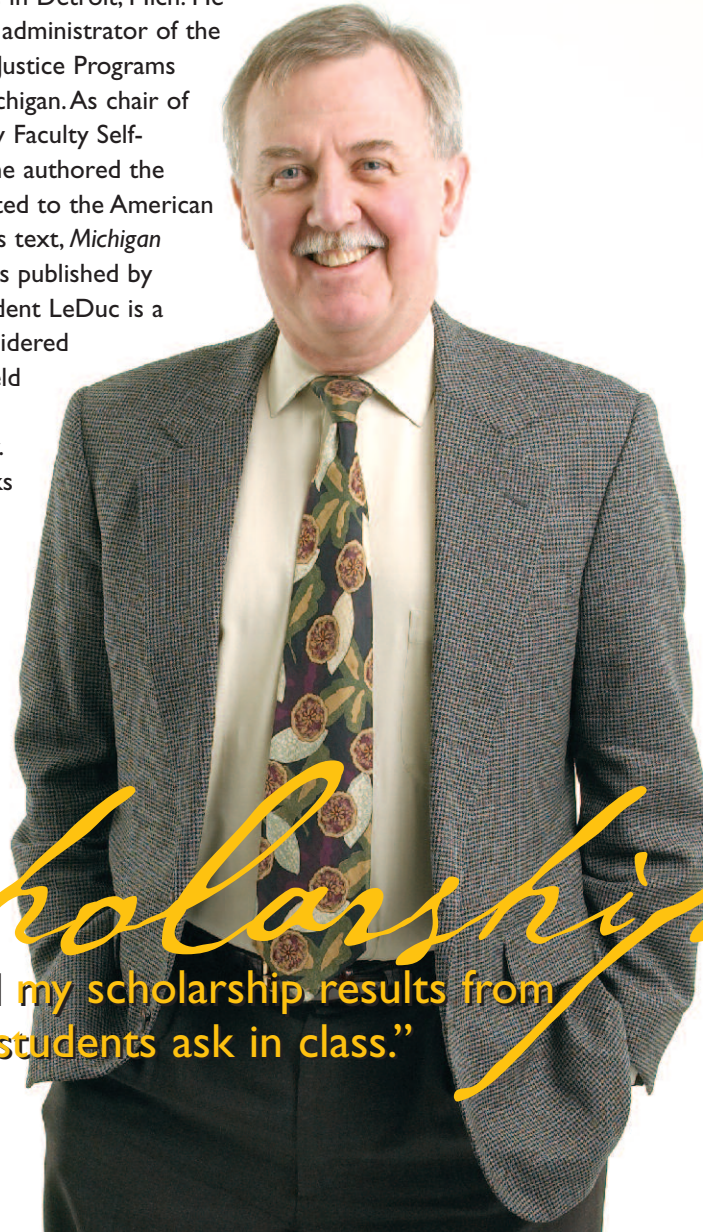


Don LeDuc

Before joining Cooley, President LeDuc served the U.S. Department of Justice as a special attorney in the criminal division. His position with the federal government included working on the Organized Crime Strike Force in Detroit, Mich. He then served as the administrator of the Office of Criminal Justice Programs for the State of Michigan. As chair of the Thomas Cooley Faculty Self-Study committee, he authored the first report submitted to the American Bar Association. His text, *Michigan Administrative Law*, is published by West Group. President LeDuc is a prolific writer considered an expert in the field of Michigan Administrative Law. His published works are often cited.
