

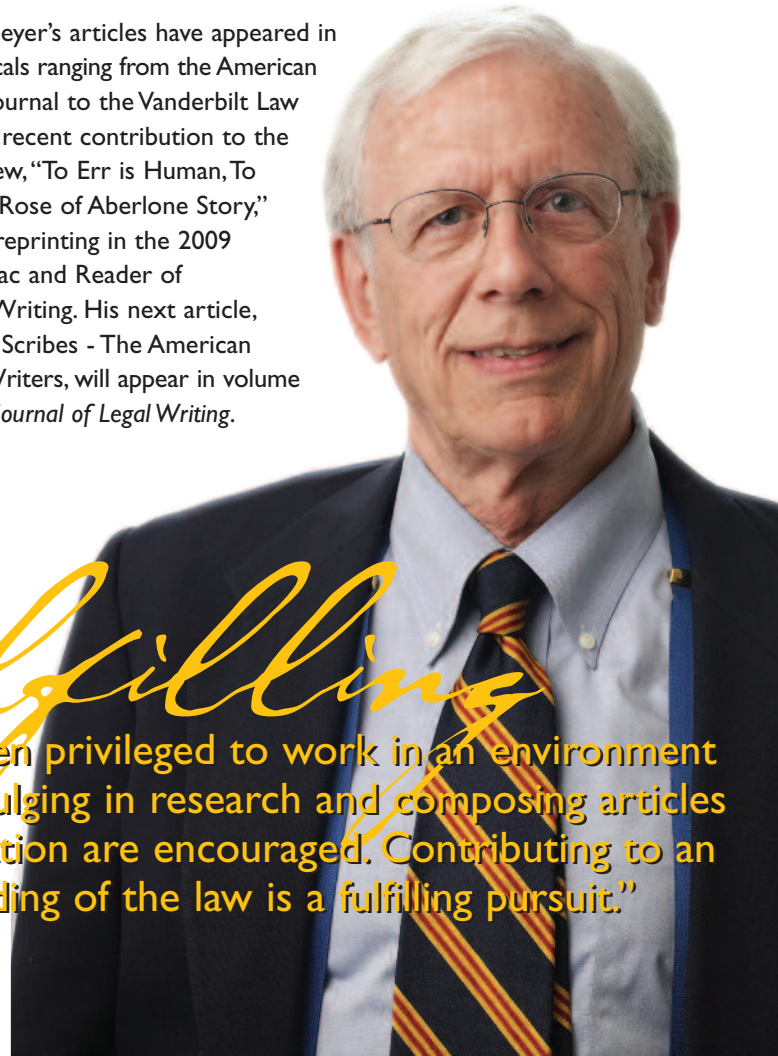
Norman Otto Stockmeyer

Emeritus Professor

Professor Stockmeyer has been researching the law and writing up the results for most of his professional life. He was a judicial law clerk, court commissioner, and director of research for the Michigan Court of Appeals before joining the Cooley Law School faculty in 1977. He has also taught as a visiting professor at California Western School of Law and Mercer University Law School.

Professor Stockmeyer was editor and co-author of the book *Michigan Law of Damages* (Institute of Continuing Legal Education, 1989). He has made presentations for the Michigan Judicial Institute, the Michigan Supreme Court Historical Society, and the ABA Appellate Judges Conference and General Practice Section.

Professor Stockmeyer's articles have appeared in dozens of periodicals ranging from the *American Bar Association Journal* to the *Vanderbilt Law Review*. His most recent contribution to the *Cooley Law Review*, "To Err is Human, To Moo Bovine: The Rose of Aberlone Story," was selected for reprinting in the 2009 *Green Bag Almanac and Reader of Exemplary Legal Writing*. His next article, on the history of Scribes - The American Society of Legal Writers, will appear in volume 12 of the *Scribes Journal of Legal Writing*.

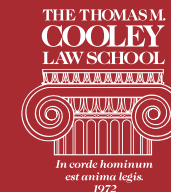

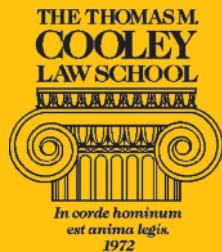
